Lay them face down and play concentration (try to find the matches).</p>	<p><u>Spelling Syllabication</u> Write each of your spelling words and draw lines to show where the word breaks into syllables.</p>	<p><u>Secret Agent Words</u> Number the alphabet from 1-26, then convert your words to a number code. Write the word on top, and the number code below.</p>	<p><u>Round Up the Rhymes</u> Write each of your words and write a rhyming word with the same spelling pattern.
